2021 Accomplishments

- Volunteers have been conducting monthly water sampling throughout the watershed to compile data for our Qualified Hydrologic Unit Plan in the works.
- A successful public educational event (part of Murrysville Community Library's "Tails and Tales" summer reading program) was held at the Murrysville Community Center in July with over 30 attendees.
- A grant application for \$2,357.00 was submitted to the Western Pennsylvania Conservancy BHE GT&S Watershed Minigrant Program for a new water quality monitor installation and organizational promotion & outreach items.
- A tree planting organized by Allegheny County Conservation District in partnership with the Municipality of Monroeville helped plant 150 native trees and shrubs in Valley Park in October.
- A \$34,000 DEP Growing Greener grant project was completed in August that stabilized 250 feet of Turtle Creek streambank along with a bridge abutment along the Westmoreland Heritage Trail.
- The spring cleanup event along Chalfant Run brought out over 100 volunteers!
- Tick safety signs provided by the PA Lyme Dare 2B Tick Aware Program were hung in our kiosks.
